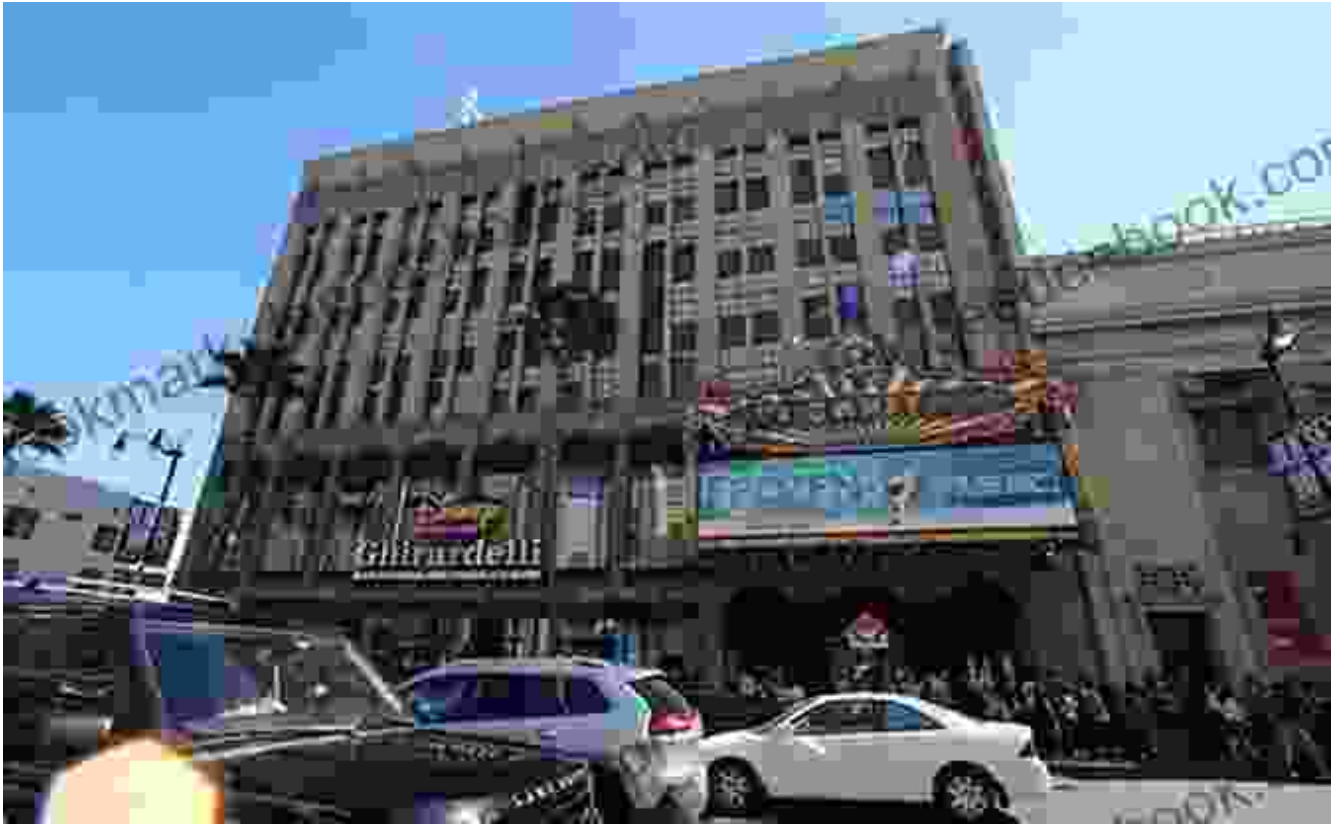

Dolby Theatre



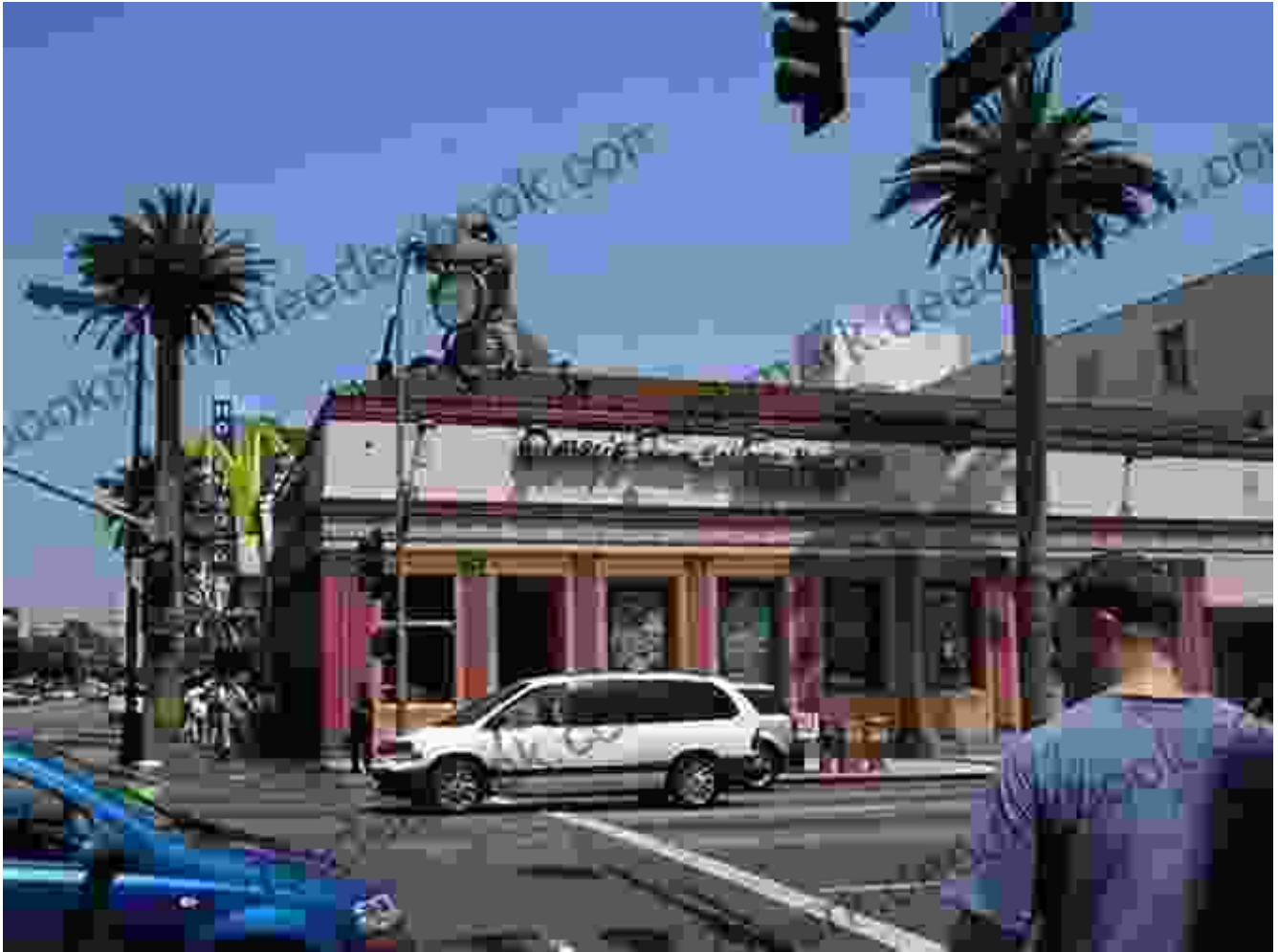

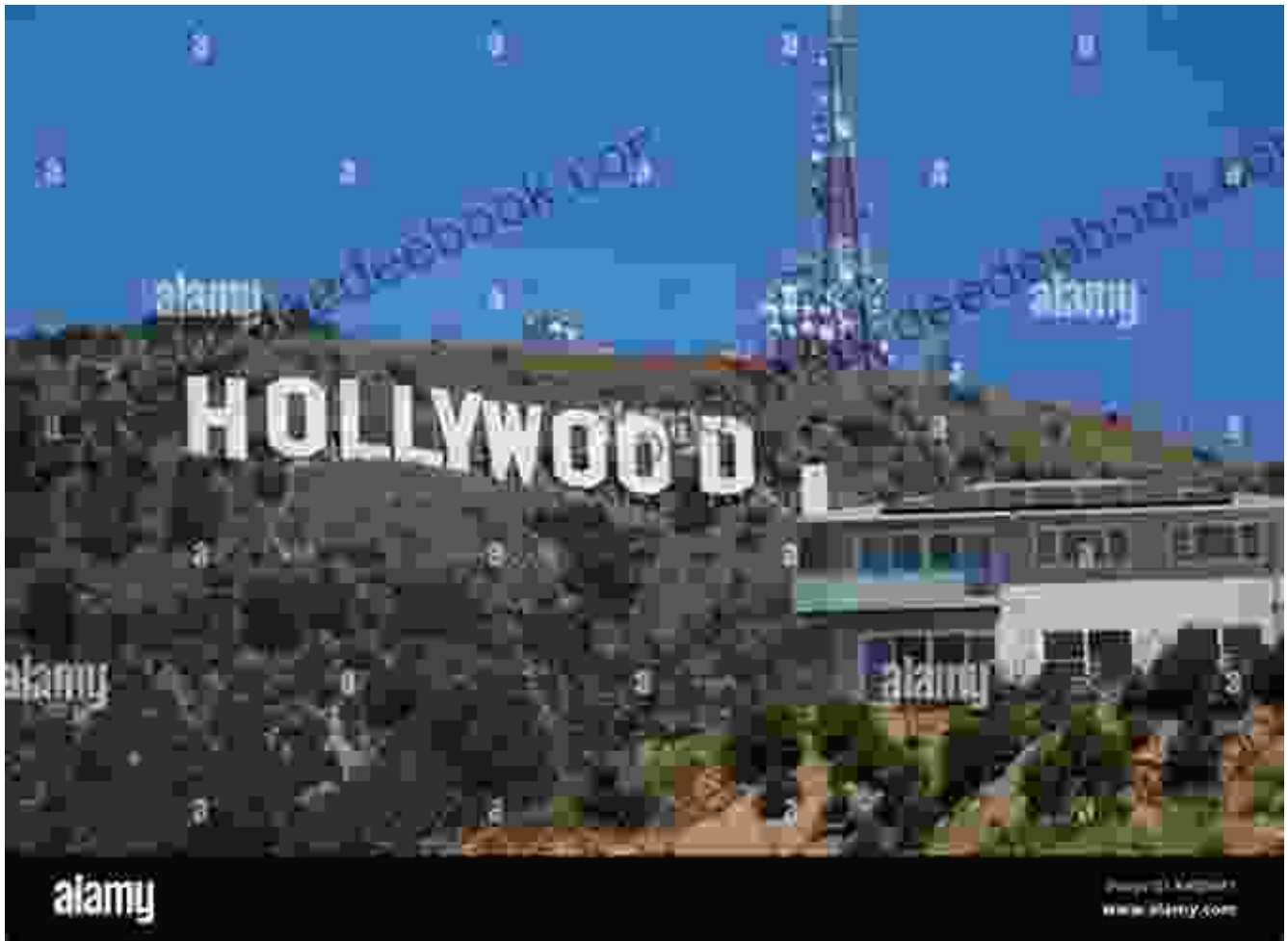
