

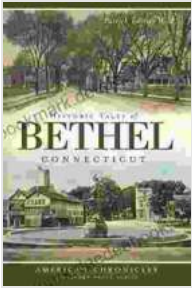

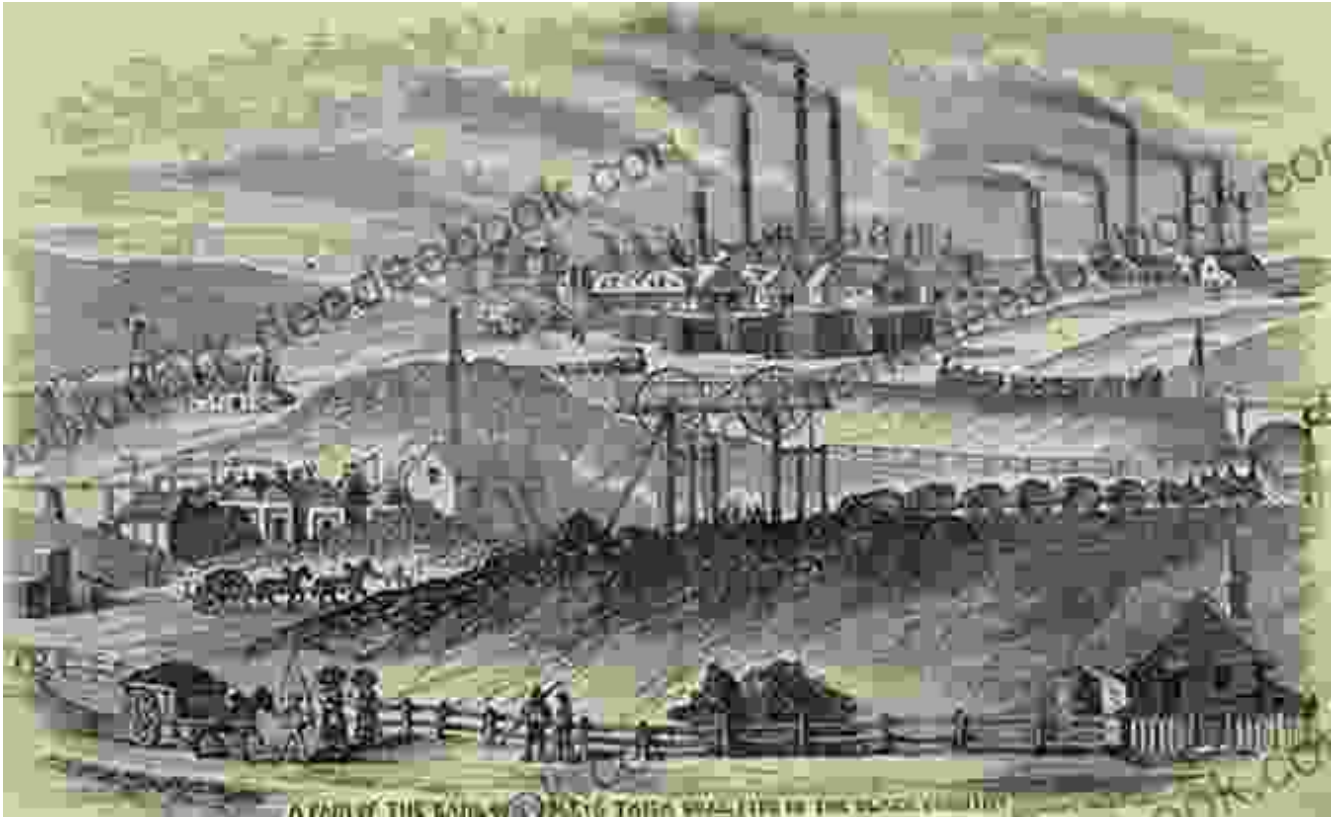

*A stone wall has joined the classics of history: the Great Wall of China and Hadrian's Wall. This story of the central moment of 20th-century European history is a remarkable illustration in the creation of a single item of material culture, showing the richness of confused meaning that may also envelop the other walls of archaeological concern.*

Though it was only built in 1961, the Berlin Wall is only an archaeological monument. Two weeks after its opening on 13 November 1961, less than half of the Berlin Wall shared Ludlow's Wall. To trace its former edge, through Germany's capital, was a job for the skills of many a field archaeologist. For archaeology, the study of material objects in a historical perspective, contemporary material objects, especially those of complex meaning and history like the Berlin Wall, use as valuable as the older border fortifications of China or of Northern Britain.

The Wall is important for several reasons.

No single event better encapsulates the 20th-century European experience than the Berlin Wall. It was the central moment of the Cold War, 1945-89 in Europe, a conflict that had its roots in the European wars of 1914-18 and 1939-45. As the northern part of the 'Iron Curtain', the fortified front line of the Soviet empire from the Baltic to the Black Sea, it was also an emblem of the division of the late 20th-century world into two political spheres. In reality, building was the symbol of the Cold War, but in a sense a symbol of its end.

was designated a National Historic Landmark.

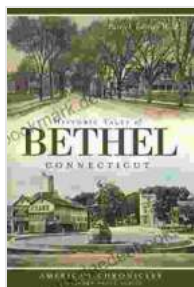
