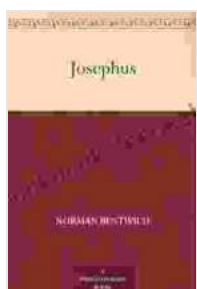


Josephus Norman Bentwich: A Pioneer in Jewish and International Affairs

Zionist Activism

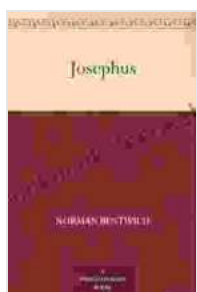
