

- Part 2: Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations
- Part 3: Commercial Driver's License Standards
- Part 4: Motor Carrier Safety Regulations for Intrastate Commerce
- Part 5: Pipeline Safety Regulations
- Part 6: Railroad Safety Regulations
- Part 7: Hazardous Materials Regulations
- Part 8: Motor Vehicle Safety Standards
- Part 9: Interstate Commerce Regulations
- Part 10: Surface Transportation Board Regulations
- Part 11: Research and Special Programs Administration Regulations
- Part 12: National Highway Traffic Safety Administration Regulations

Each part of the CFR is further divided into chapters, subchapters, and sections. The CFR is organized in a hierarchical manner, with each level of the hierarchy being more specific than the one above it.




