


Secretary of the Interior, instilling in Morris a deep passion for public service.




Political Rise

Udall entered politics in 1954 when he was elected to the Arizona State Senate. He served two terms before winning a seat in the U.S. House of Representatives in 1961. As a congressman, Udall became known for his sharp wit and strong environmental advocacy.
